- Encourage programs to do self-reflection on sustainability measures: I wished to note that I've learned of a number of departments/programs engaging in developing approaches to make their curriculums more efficient (more sustainable) while still meeting program needs. All this helps since we must have programs that are effective, academically, but also fiscally sustainable.
- Willamette Promise and OSU: as previously referenced in Faculty Senate, some resistance exists to
 acceptance of Willamette Promise credits principally, by OSU & OSU Cascades. OSU interim provost Ron
 Adams and I are organizing a meeting between Willamette Promise faculty/staff and academic leadership at
 OSU to attempt to resolve the issue.
- Faculty Senate recommended criteria for awarding Emeritus status: I've asked deans to review the document with division chairs one more time to identify any operational impediments.
- Pastega Award nominations are due: email was sent out reminding faculty, staff, students about nomination
 of individuals for the Pastega Award for Excellence in Teaching, and the Pastega Award for Excellence in
 Scholarship. Information can be found at:
