BA/BS Task Force Summary of Recommendations

From the NWCCU degree glossary:

- The BA degree implies a more liberal education orientation
 - Given WOU's identity and mission as a liberal arts institution to which our General Education Learning Outcomes align, programs may choose to default to meeting BA requirements
 - Programs have agency in building their requirements to best meet the needs of students
- The BS degree implies a more applied educational orientation
 - Some programs have been designed to emphasize practical and applied skills. These programs can request a BS by providing evidence for courses that:
 - i. impart discipline-specific tools and models for problem solving
 - ii. build competence in skills used in practice
 - iii. are clearly tied to a specific or identifiable industry, career or field of work
- Program articulation to BS is a one-time process for existing programs coupled with whatever 90-credit program review process is established at WOU.
 - Programs wishing to offer **both** BA and BS options will articulate, using the same criteria, how the BS is different from the BA.
 - Subsequent program revisions or new programs will go through the established curriculum process.
- For programs requiring second-language proficiency above 103 (either BA or BS) if the desired proficiency has the potential of bumping the major's credits above 90, they can have up to 12 over 90.
