

Faculty Senate President's Report

- 1. There have been multiple communications between concerned stakeholders about the Salem site and related matters. FSEC has been in regular communication with Interim Provost Winningham on this matter. Given the limitations, liabilities, and concerns, I am convinced that Provost Winningham has an effective plan for addressing these concerns while keeping WOU faculty and staff informed. Note: WOUFT has also been included in the loop.
- 2. FSEC continues to work, slowly but surely, with Staff Senate, WOUFT, and SEIU Sub-Local 082, and administration to address matters of civility on campus.
- 3. Course approval process has been going relatively smoothly from the FSEC end; grateful for the Curriculum and GenEd committees' work.
