- 5. FY 21-22 Preliminary Allocation Discussion
 - Deciding the budget and the fee for entire school year
 - Make cuts and make a decision
- 6. FY 21-22 Preliminary Allocation Decision
 - Area Heads did presentations on their budget request
 - Full academic year including summer
 - i. Darrin: 1400 students during summer projected, 2 tier 10% of students: 10% less than 6 credits, 90% 6 or more credits.
 - Patrick: Considering tiers this year?
 - i. Makana: IFC can discuss fee tiers
 - ii. Nick: flat rate makes sense
 - iii. Carlos: No tier system, flat rate best
 - iv. Hunter: Favor tier system
 - v. Kayley: Flat fee better option
 - Discussion about cuts to budgets
 - i. Cut packages have been prepared by Area Heads.
 - ii. Athletics no cut package presented travel budget: Fall \$275,000 - Winter \$180,000 - Spring \$217,500
 - iii. Blanca: In favor of cutting travel by 50%.
 - iv. Carlos: Cut travel for fall and winter sports. Still early in full country vaccination.
 - v. Makana: We can't tell the area head what to do with their budget.
 - vi. Liz: Couple concerns. University might say that if IFC does not fund Athletic travel the university is gonna crumble. I would like to see the travel budget more and what is allocated, but if the university says travel is safe and necessary in order to keep our standing then the funding could come from elsewhere. There have to be cuts to not take too much from reserves, and burden students. IFC has been thinking of priorities during COVID, admin was not concerned with student employment, student services and programs and cutting staff. IFC going back to what is important to students especially during a pandemic.
 - vii. Darin: IFC reserve account are \$800,000
 - What is the maximum amount of IFC Fee we want to charge?

- Kayley: I motion for FY22 preliminary allocation open hearing that we present 2 different options to the student body. Option #3 which is \$345 fee during the school year, given to students taking classes regardless of the modality as well as a \$125 IFC fee for students taking classes during Summer time regardless of modality, and for option #3 a flat fee if taking 1 credit or 12 credits the fee is the same. Option #4 \$350 for the school year, to be an IFC fee for the students regardless of course modality and \$125 fee for Summer regardless of course modality given as a flat fee, no tier system no matter how many credits a student is taking.
 - i. Blanca: I second \$345 flat fee, \$125 flat fee and \$350 and \$125 flat fee regardless
