This year, we have served a total of 43 children

- 12 children have parents attending WOU
- 8 children have parents that are WOU Faculty/Staff
- 23 children have parents who come from the community
- We employ 20 WOU students part-time, most are from the College of Education.





How much does child care cost?

- **\$2,665 to \$3,060** per term for full-time, 11 week term, Monday to Friday 7:30 a.m. to 5:15 p.m.
- This equals **\$888 to \$1,020 per month for 9 months**
- The WOU CDC is slightly lower than the median tuition in the area.





IFC FY 24-25 Academic Year Funding Use

- **Fall 2023** - IFC served 12 WOU students at the CDC at 50% subsidy = \$7,972
- **Winter & Spring 2024** - TBD -higher than Fall 2023
- Balance used towards student payroll in Spring Term 2024.





IFC FY 24-25 Academic Year Funding Request

We are requesting our service level funding to be the same as the 2023-24 year:

➤ **\$39,540**

- **Cut @ 5% = \$ 37,563**
- **Cut @ 10%= \$ 35,586**
- **Cut @ 15%= \$ 33,609**





How will cuts affect the CDC?

- Percentage of subsidy for WOU Student Parents could drop from 50% to 30% or less
- No remaining funds to support student payroll in the Spring Term





IFC dollars at work-Student Parents

- 100% of IFC Funds go first, directly to subsidize the WOU students' childcare tuition. (Currently 30-50%)
- The IFC tuition subsidy helps to recruit non-traditional students with children to attend WOU preschool.
- CDC helps encourage retention of WOU students by supporting parents with affordable childcare which removes a common barrier to completing their education





IFC dollars at work-Student Employees

- WOU CDC provides on-campus part-time employment for 20 College of Education students. Any balance in IFC not used for subsidized child care tuition will be used in Spring Term for Student Payroll.
