- Welcome President Peters
- Introductions
- Review [proposed revised charge](#) with Dr. Peters
 - Charge
 - Review that UTAC was created to support shared governance at WOU
 - Chelle
 - UTAC has made some changes based on UTAC being in an advocacy role
 - Included components to ensure student voices are heard, included
 - Develop ability to advise on technology policies
 - Place to support visioning technology on campus
 - Thinking about technology as a community
 - Pres Peters
 - Likes charge
 - Supports committee to feel empowered to make suggestions
 - Also advocacy, exchange of ideas with the President
 - Committee shouldn't always wait to be consulted, but raise issues that committee sees as important to President
 - Potentially suggesting technology changes/needs as they come up
 - Amy
 - There's been some struggle about advisory type of work

- Multiple subcommittees or working groups (banner user; data integrity [DIG]) have been formed
- Challenge is coordination between them and ensuring that their work is effective
- Perhaps have UTAC as a coordinating group or umbrella for the smaller working groups
- Pres Peters
 - Challenge of having representatives from community stakeholders versus having a manageable committee size
 - Does not want to micro-manage
 - Try to keep it effective but manageable
 - If member number is smaller, then still have other experts/stakeholders who can come to meetings that are relevant/impacted by them
 - Technology is a web that reaches across campus
 - Need to make sure that when tech decisions are made that impact campus users, those users need to be informed so it's not a surprise
- Amy
 - How does UTAC find its place in decision making
- Pres Peters
 - How do we advance technology on campus?
 - Ensuring when switches/changes in technologies/software/services, that there is plenty of time to have conversations with users about impacts and how it could improve users' experience.
 - Also planning cost, implementation
 - Also making suggestions about possible changes
- Chelle
 - UTAC has strong capacity to foster campus conversations/discussions about technology, but how does UTAC learn about these different initiatives?
 - Difficult to engage or advise if UTAC does not know.
 - Thus student impact/voice may be missed.
 - UTAC has discussed having specific triggers to initiate UTAC's involvement
 - If there's a specific price point, if something goes through legal like cybersecurity, or if it's student facing
- Amy
 - Some challenges are when there's some specific software used only by specific units
 - How do you gather/gain this information?
- Pres Peters
 - May be an opportunity to start shifting culture

- Ask Staff and Faculty Senates to potentially discuss the role of committees like this and how to use them more effectively
- Need impacted people involved to avoid unexpected problems
- Doesn't know about needing to submit routine reports to Board of Trustees and University Cabinet
 - Admin and Finance Subcommittee
- Chelle
 - How do we ensure a two way communication channel between UTAC and senior leadership about what UTAC is working on?
 - This enables having other broader perspectives from folks in Cabinet about other initiatives that may be happening on campus but UTAC doesn't yet know about.
- Pres Peters
 - Connections potentially to University Council
 - Perhaps set out a chunk of time to share information and hear back
 - Make it regular and formalized as opposed to informal—get involved in process consistently
- Chelle
 - Make sure UTAC is empowered to also engage, discuss with campus leadership
 - And get feedback if UTAC ideas, initiatives, are viable
- Pres Peters
 - Other leaders on campus may have some ideas about ways technology can be used—and also answer why, or why not, we are using specific technologies
- Amy
 - Ideally, UTAC could help bring forward ideas, identify resources that could support the ideas, and then the benefits of said ideas; thus bringing forth possible proposals
- Pres Peters
 - Appreciates the revisions
 - Wants to see UTAC be more functional
 - Help people understand why and how things work
- Amy
 - Should we do something about the BFCC and DIG group?
- Bill
 - We don't have HR representative on UTAC, and so making sure that they're included if we're discussing software that they're using or it may be impacted
 - Invite them?
 - Include them on the subcommittee?
- Amy

- Important to create some connections/structure that includes BFCC and DIG because Payroll and/or HR have people on those subcommittees
 - Try to avoid creating too many more committees—rather making use of the subcommittees and their work in more coordinated ways
 - How does one make the communication more efficient between UTAC and its subcommittees?
 - Banner Functional Coordinating users
 - Meets once a month
 - Helps coordinate for clones, upgrades
 - Might also be able to bring up ideas to UTAC or have UTAC ask them to consider specific projects
 - Like testing environments, timeframes, etc.
 - Data Integrity Group
 - Meets monthly
 - Think about timing DIG and BFCC meetings so that they can bring stuff to UTAC
- Point on importance of structure
- There's been turnover in the subcommittees, so perhaps reinvigorate and realign how they interact with UTAC
- Dona
 - DIG is solid; smaller than when it first started
 - BFCC: more about which areas on campus are testing things so they don't step on each other's toes
 - E.g. don't do upgrades, etc.
 - Coordinate blackout dates
- Amy
 - Was thinking maybe expanding BFCC's role
 - Not just banner users directly, but it's used by core offices that could have useful insights
 - Sees potential of BFCC's role expand beyond just Banner
 - For example, if/when it rolls out and then what it's going to look like
 - Trying to create streamlined, consistent student/user experience
- Dona
 - Everyone uses Banner (WolfWeb)
 - So if there are changes, all WOU folks will be impacted
 - Maybe UTAC can help educate/train campus and/or to seek ideas about how to improve the new Banner
- Amy
 - Expand scope of BFCC
- Chelee

- Logistically, it seems like it would be easy to make these changes
 - Some current DIG & BFCC members are on UTAC
 - For UTAC, DIG & BFCC could report to UTAC and potentially bring agenda items to UTAC for it to consider
 - Amy
 - Reviewing the charge, maybe one step is to formalize the communication/coordination/reporting relationship
 - How often, what expectation, what are responsibilities
 - How does it work?
 - Importance of creating structure and ensuring that it is in UTAC's Revised Charge
 - Amy volunteered to propose some language
 - Chelle
 - There are no objections to Amy's suggestion about proposing language
 - Appears that we are good to go with the charge
- Membership
 - Chelle
 - Financial Aid–potential members
 - This point there are vacancies
 - We can outreach now or a bit later to try and fill the vacancies with the new charge
 - Amy
 - we should reach out to HR, Financial Aid
 - Maybe include Admissions if they have time, bandwidth
 - Folks are not sure if Admissions is part of DIG, UTAC, or
 - Amy: we should have Admissions at the table somewhere, whether DIG or UTAC...
 - Dona: suggests DIG given basic talks about data, consistency, etc.
 - Seems like the most relevant spot
 - Admissions is where all the data for students start
 - Chelle
 - Framing UTAC as nucleus of network
 - UTAC is strategic piece
 - DIG, BFCC have operational pieces
 - List DIG, BFCC as part of UTAC
 - Still members of UTAC even if they only go to DIG or BFCC meetings
 - Amy
 - DIG, BFCC, UTAC already meet during the same week but different days
 - Chelle

- April meeting: maybe have it as a call for all people on DIG, BFCC, and UTAC at one meeting to figure out if everyone wants to handle it that way
 - Will not add admissions to UTAC members list
 - Cause they may likely be in DIG or BFCC
 - Relabel DIG, BFCC not as subcommittee but as an allied working group/aspect of UTAC
 - Amy
 - UTAC has the connection at level with cabinet that DIG and BFCC does not have
 - Chelle
 - Leave name at standing subcommittee for DIG, BFCC?
 - Mike
 - If we're agreeing on the membership, does that mean IR is no longer on UTAC?
 - There's already an IR member on DIG
 - IR's role is more relevant to DIG than it is to UTAC's larger role of promoting technology use on campus
 - Chelle
 - Current membership list is on the UTAC Charge Review document
 - Refers back to conversation with Pres Peters
 - Ideas, strategies can start with UTAC
 - We've talked about it a bit, but we don't have a system for how that might work
 - Wants to encourage, faculty/staff representatives about how that might work
 - Surveys to find out pain points
 - Perhaps do a faculty technology use survey
 - How are we identifying possible projects, ideas, goals that are from the committee as well as from the community outside of UTAC.
 - Amy
 - How do we understand/get a sense of what our user community is experiencing—what might be helpful or what some problems are.
 - Perhaps subcommittees could be a place
 - Bring things to UTAC
 - Maybe have standing meeting agenda items
 - What projects are people working on
 - What problems have people brought to you
 - Sharing for awareness—quick check in
